SUMMARY

Brazil ranks 82 in the Open Data Inventory 2017 with an overall score of 40%. The overall score is a combination of a data coverage subscore of 41% and a data openness subscore of 38%.

Brazil scores higher than the regional median for economic and environmental statistics. Within the country, the highest levels of coverage and openness are on economic statistics and the lowest levels are on social statistics.

RECOMMENDATIONS

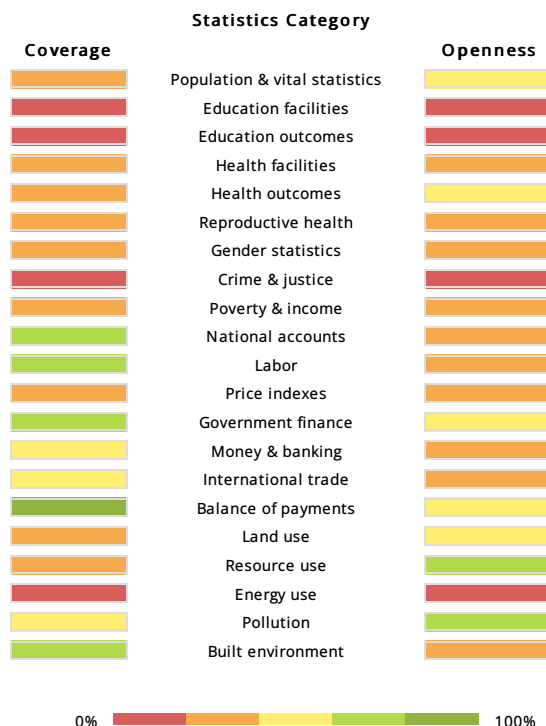
Coverage

- Collect and publish more disaggregated data in social and environmental statistics.
- Collect and publish more data that are disaggregated by sex and are relevant to the welfare of women and their children.

Openness

- Create a clear and open terms of use policy, such as CC BY 4.0, for all websites publishing official statistics.
- Publish more social data in machine-readable and non-proprietary formats such as XLSX, CSV, or JSON.
