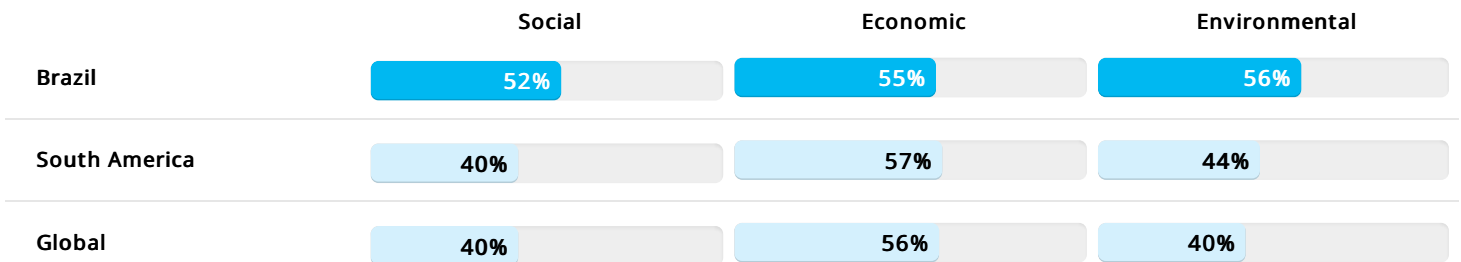

SUMMARY

Brazil ranks 56 in the Open Data Inventory 2018 with an overall score of 54%. The overall score is a combination of a data coverage subscore of 59% and a data openness subscore of 50%.

Brazil scores higher than the regional median for social and environmental statistics. Within the country, the highest levels of coverage and openness are on environmental statistics and the lowest levels are on social statistics.

RECOMMENDATIONS

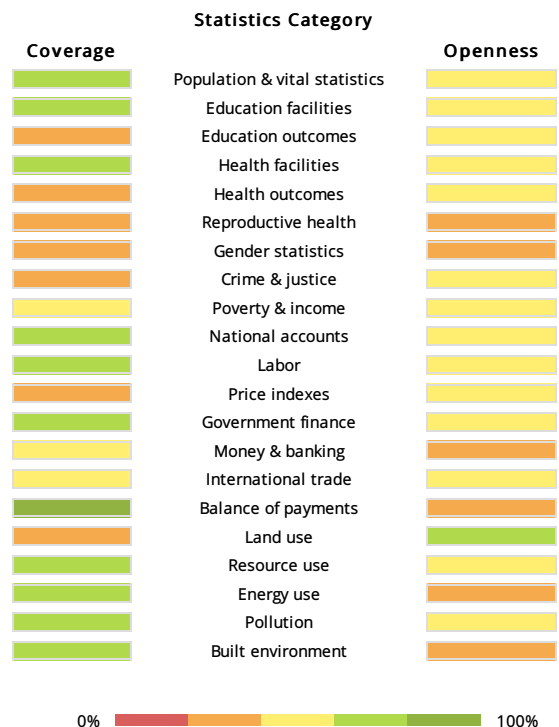
Coverage

- Collect and publish more data disaggregated at the second administrative level across all data categories.

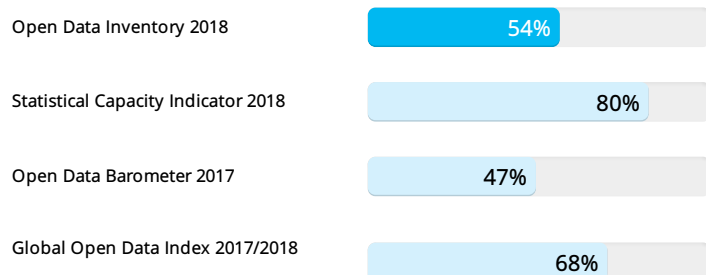
Openness

- Create a clear and open terms of use policy, such as CC BY 4.0, for all websites publishing official statistics.
- Publish more economic and environmental data in non-proprietary formats such as XLSX, CSV, or JSON.
