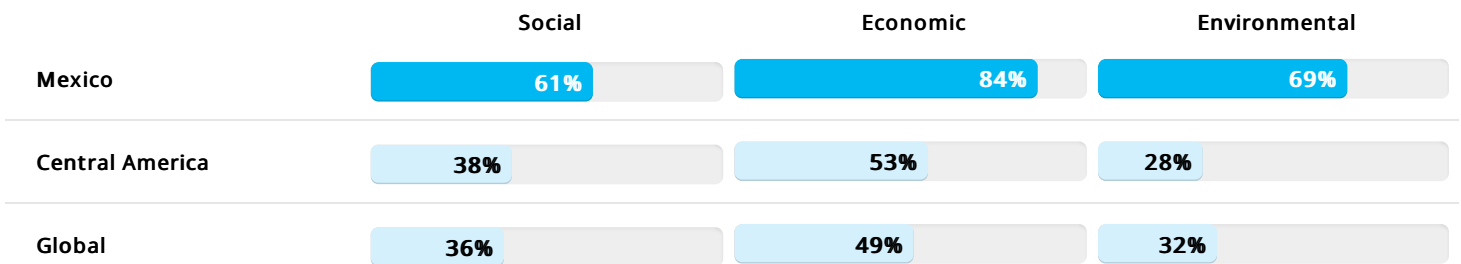

## SUMMARY

Mexico ranks 9 in the Open Data Inventory 2017 with an overall score of 71%. The overall score is a combination of a data coverage subscore of 56% and a data openness subscore of 85%.

Mexico scores higher than the regional median across all three major data categories. Within the country, the highest levels of coverage and openness are on economic statistics and the lowest levels are on social statistics.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

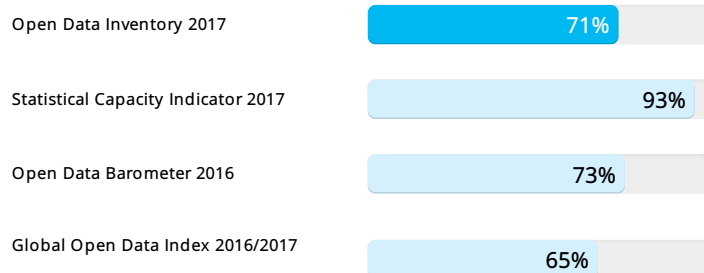
### Coverage

- Collect and publish more historical data in social and environmental statistics.

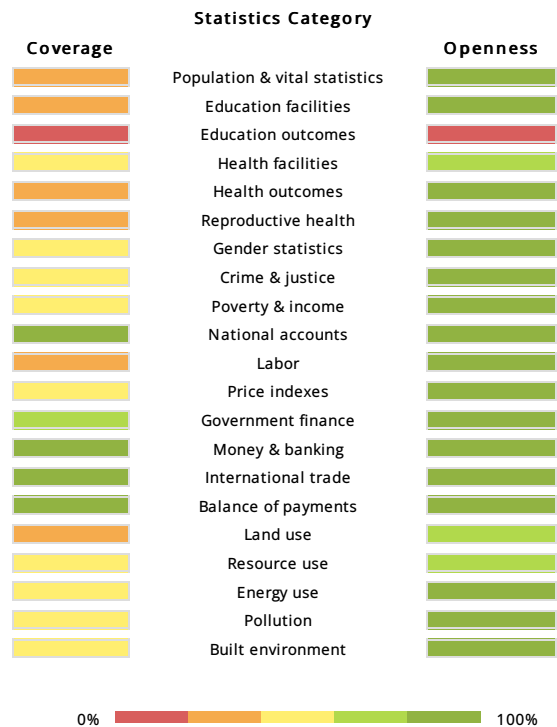
### Openness
